# GET RID OF UNUSED OPIOID MEDICINE

Remember to get rid of unused medications, including opioids, when you are done taking the medicine. Leaving unused opioids in the home can increase the chance of other people finding and using them.

Younger children or pets may find them and accidentally swallow the medication. Find a medicine drop-off location or use an at-home medication disposal bag to get rid of extra medicine.
